5 6	The meeting of the Project Review Committee was held at the Swanton Village Complex in Swanton, VT. At 5:42 PM, A. LaRocque opened the meeting.

16	N. Speer requested moving the Village of Swanton/Bourne's Energy project to the first project review.
17	A. LaRocque requested moving the South Hero project to the second project review. She also
18	requested moving the approval of minutes after the project reviews. T. Newton noted that the Yankee
19	Corporation project in Georgia did not need to be reviewed since it was already approved by the
20	District Commission. A. Larocque also requested to add an item on the agenda about grid constraints in
21	the region. The Committee agreed to make all these changes.

26	Project Reviews
27	Village of Country and Bourney's Fragge. 70 Lafey Street. Village of Country
28 29	Village of Swanton and Bourne's Energy – 70 Lafar Street, Village of Swanton Project Details: Act 250 application – Installation of an 18,000 gallon above-ground propane tank. The
30	tank would be installed on a concrete pad surrounded by crushed stone. A 10' by 10' storage shed
31	would also be constructed. The area would be surrounded by a 5' tall chain link fence. The fenced
32	compound would also be utilized to store smaller propane tanks supplied to the residential market and
33	for storage of related equipment.

35	N. Speer provided an overview of the project. He noted that VTrans has said that a permit is required
36	to cross the railtrail even though Swanton already crosses the railtrail to access Project 10, the natural
37	gas peaking plant owned by VPPSA and operated by Swanton Electric. T. Newton also noted that the
38	Agency of Natural Resources stated that a Wetland Permit would also be required for the project. The
39	Committee discussed the merits of intervening in these issues. C. Steen stated that the Committee
40	should restrict comments to conformance with the Regional Plan.

42 43	A. Voegele motioned to find that the project does not have a substantial regional impact and is in conformance with the Regional Plan. C. Steen seconded. All in favor.

134 Ferry Road, LLC – 134 Ferry Road, Town of South Hero

Project Details: Act 250 application — Construction of a 7,884 sf repair shop for cars, boats, and farm equipment along with a new parking area, driveway, and stormwater improvements.

T. Newton noted that the Committee had reviewed this project already, but thought that the Committee should reconsider the project, specifically conformance with Criterion 9(L). N. Speer also noted the discrepancy with the VTrans 1111 Permit and T. Newton noted the discrepancy with the State Water/Wastewater Permit. The Committee discussed Criterion 9(L). T. Newton noted that there were several ways the project could be changed to better meet the Criterion. The Committee reviewed the applicant's responses to the application questions about Criterion 9(L). A. Voegele stated that screening could be included to better screen the structure from the road. C. Steen stated that she thought the Committee should just request additional information from the applicant about the project's conformance with Criterion 9(L). The Committee agreed. The Committee did not make any actions regarding substantial regional impact or conformance with the regional plan.

Berkshire Sand and Gravel, LLC – Water Tower Road, Town of Berkshire

Project Details: Act 250 application – Expansion of existing sand/gravel site and addition of a wash plan.

T. Newton noted that the District Commission has not made any progress on this application and wondered if had not yet been deemed complete. C. Charron noted that this project had not yet been approved by the Berkshire DRB. C. Steen asked how far structures are from the extraction site. T. Newton stated that the nearest structure is located well over 1000 feet away from the site. H. Garrett noted the project is pretty remote. A. Voegele stated that the applicant may have to reapply if not all the appropriate materials are submitted to the District Commission. The Committee decided to wait until more information is submitted before making action on this project.

Grid Constraints

A. LaRocque stated that the Rainville Solar project in Fairfield applied for their interconnection permit with Green Mountain Power and the applicants were told that the project could only be half of the originally proposed size due to grid constraints. A. LaRocque asked the Committee if there was any way the Project Review Committee could help applicants like Mr. Rainville better understand where grid constraints are located in the region to ensure transparency. T. Newton noted he asked the project developer, Catamount Solar, about grid constraints during a Committee meeting in the Spring of 2018 and was assured by Catamount Solar that Green Mountain Power had determined there weren't any grid restrictions in the vicinity. C. Steen noted that the RPC can't really provide more information than Green Mountain Power. The Committee agreed that it couldn't likely provide applicants with any real information about grid constraints in the region and that this issue should be left to the applicant and the utilities

A. LaRocque requested an update on SHEI and a review of the new net-metering rules in the future.
